### Forget Me Not

The Forget Me Not flower symbolizes true love, enduring memory and faithfulness. It is where we get the phrase True Blue.

Dormant through the winter they appear dead, but come spring they show their beautiful shades of blue colors.

Freemasons began using the flower in 1926 as a symbol not to forget the poor and desperate. In early 1934, soon after Hitler's rise to power it became evident that Freemasonry was in danger. In that same year "the Grand Lodge of the Sun" in Germany adopted the flower as a substitute for the traditional square and compasses when it was dangerous to openly reveal one was a mason. The little blue flower, the forget me not allowed masons to be able to recognize one another.

In German legend, God named all the plants when a tiny unnamed one cried out "forget me not, O' Lord." God replied "That shall be your name."

In Greek legend, when the creator thought he had finished giving the flowers their colors, he heard one whisper "forget me not." There was nothing left but a very small amount of blue, but the forget me not was delighted to wear such a lite blue shade. Forget me not. We all want to be remembered. We want our families to remember us as loving and supportive and our friends to remember us as loyal and kind. As Masons, we want to be remembered for our charity and brotherly love. We are taught in masonry, charity extends from the grave. We will be remembered for our good deeds and charity to all. Forget me not.

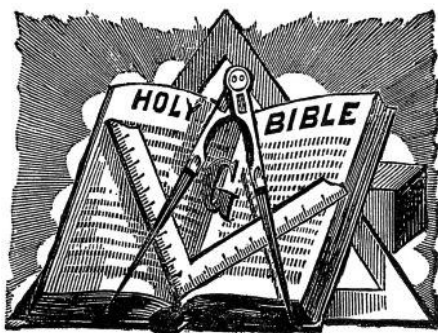

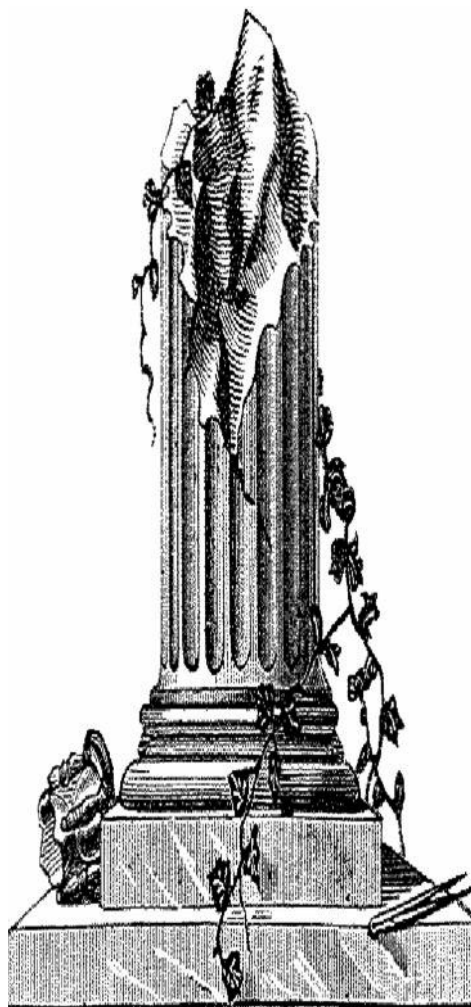

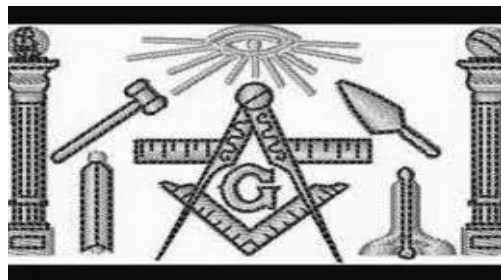

## April Freemason History

**April 4: On this date in 1778, Voltaire was initiated in "Les Neuf Soeurs" Lodge in Paris. His conductors were Benjamin Franklin and Count Gebelin**

**April 5: On this date in 1886, Rudyard Kipling received his 1st degree.**

**April 8: On this date in 1790, the Grand Lodge of New Hampshire was constituted**

**April 19: On this date in 1787, the Grand Lodge of Maryland was formed**

**On this date (or April 18) in 1850, the Grand Lodge of California was formed**

**April 20: On this date in 1884, Pope Leo XIII issued a famous Papal Bull against Freemasonry, titled Humanum Genus.**

**April 21: On this date in 1821 the Grand Lodge of Missouri was founded.**

**April 22: On this date in 1785, Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart received his 3rd degree.**

**April 24: On this date in 1901, President Theodore Roosevelt received his 3rd degree.**

**April 28: On this date in 1738, Pope Clement XII issued the first Papal Bull attacking Freemasonry**

## April Fools History

**On this day in 1700, English pranksters begin popularizing the annual tradition of April Fools' Day by playing practical jokes on each other. Although the day, also called All Fools' Day, has been celebrated for several centuries by different cultures, its exact origins remain a mystery. Some historians speculate that April Fools' Day dates back to 1582, when France switched from the Julian calendar to the Gregorian calendar, as called for by the Council of Trent in 1563. People who were slow to get the news or failed to recognize that the start of the New Year had moved to January 1 and continued to celebrate it during the last week of March through April 1 became the butt of jokes and hoaxes. These included having paper fish placed on their backs and being referred to as "poisson d'avril" (April fish), said to symbolize a young, easily caught fish and a gullible person.**

**Historians have also linked April Fools' Day to ancient festivals such as Hilaria, which was celebrated in Rome at the end of March and involved people dressing up in disguises. There's also speculation that April Fools' Day was tied to the vernal equinox, or first day of spring in the Northern Hemisphere, when Mother Nature fooled people with changing, unpredictable weather. April Fools' Day spread throughout Britain during the 18th century. In Scotland, the tradition became a two-day event, starting with "hunting the gowk," in which people were sent on phony errands (gowk is a word for cuckoo bird, a symbol for fool) and followed by Tailie Day, which involved pranks played on people's derrieres, such as pinning fake tails or "kick me" signs on them.**

**In modern times, people have gone to great lengths to create elaborate April Fools' Day hoaxes. Newspapers, radio and TV stations and Web sites have participated in the April 1 tradition of reporting outrageous fictional claims that have fooled their audiences. In 1957, the BBC reported that Swiss farmers were experiencing a record spaghetti crop and showed footage of people harvesting noodles from trees; numerous viewers were fooled. In 1985, Sports Illustrated tricked many of its readers when it ran a made-up article about a rookie pitcher named Sidd Finch who could throw a fastball over 168 miles per hour. In 1996, Taco Bell, the fast-food restaurant chain, duped people when it announced it had agreed to purchase Philadelphia's Liberty Bell and intended to rename it the Taco Liberty Bell. In 1998, after Burger King advertised a "Left-Handed Whopper," scores of clueless customers requested the fake sandwich.**

### Frogs Meet Wave

April 1, 1906: The front page of the *Wichita Daily Eagle* carried news of an astounding natural phenomena. A huge wave, eleven-feet high, was moving southward down the Arkansas River. Simultaneously, a giant mass of millions of frogs, spanning a distance of over eleven miles, was migrating northward up the river. The two (wave and frogs) were predicted to meet at Wichita at around 10 o'clock that morning. The report brought out thousands of Kansans who lined the banks of the river, eager to see such a once-in-a-lifetime event. After three hours the wonder never materialized, it occurred to the crowd *what day it was* and they dispersed quietly back to their homes.
