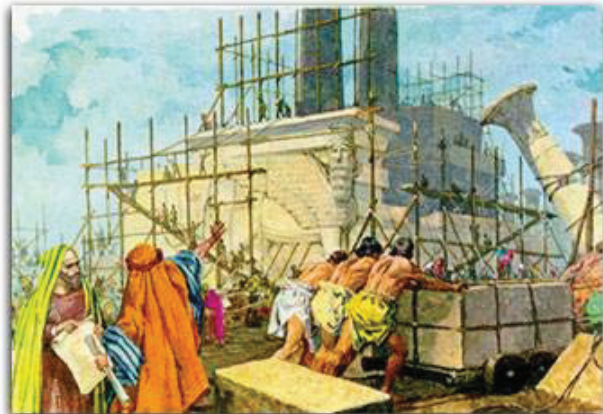

FREEMASONS IN THE AIR

On his famous solo flight over the Atlantic in 1927 Colonel Charles A. Lindbergh wore the square and compasses on his jacket as a good luck emblem. He was a Mason at the time.

When Bernt Balchen, explorer and air pioneer, flew over the North Pole and the South Pole with Brother Richard E. Byrd, they dropped Masonic flags on both Poles. In the 1933-35 expedition over the South Pole, Brother Balchen also tossed his Shrine fez on the Pole.

Leroy Gordon Cooper, Jr., famous astronaut, on his 22 orbit flight carried a Masonic coin in his pocket as well as a blue Masonic flag which he later presented to his mother lodge, Carbondale No. 82, Carbondale, Colorado.

On August 23, 1879, Lodge No. 239 of France held a meeting in a balloon flying over Paris, at which time a Brother was initiated.

The inventors of the first balloon were Joseph Montgolfier, Michel Montgolfier, and Jacques Etienne; all were members of the Nine Sisters Lodge in France.

Brother Eddie Rickenbacker, World War I air ace, was a devoted Mason for many years.

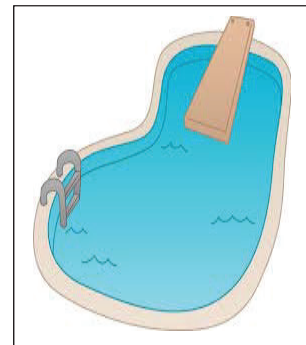

By-Laws of Laurel Lodge No. 237 F. & AM

Laurel Springs, NJ 08021

Constituted May 22nd, 1922

Constituted by and under the authority of a warrant issued by the Most Ancient and Honorable Society of Free and Accepted Masons for the State of New Jersey on the 20th day of April, A.D. 1922, A.L. 5922

ARTICLE I- COMMUNICATIONS

The regular Communication of this Lodge shall be held on the first and third Friday of each month except during the months of July and August and on the third Friday in December. If the first Friday in January falls on the 1st of the month (New Year's Day) there will be no communication. The Regular Communication shall begin at 7:45 PM. The Worshipful Master may, at his discretion, open a regular Communication up to one hour earlier that the prescribed time provided that due and timely notice shall be given to every member and that no business shall be transacted until the regular hour stated above.

The Annual Meeting of the Lodge shall take place at an Emergent Communication on the third Friday or Saturday of December at the discretion of the lodge. All committee reports shall be due and the election of Officers shall take place at this Emergent Communication.

ARTICLE II- OFFICERS

SECTION 1. The Elected Officers of this Lodge shall consist of the Worshipful Master, a Senior Warden, a Junior Warden, a Treasurer, and a Secretary. There shall also be elected at this Communication; a Proxy to Grand Lodge.

SECTION 2. The appointed officers shall consist of Senior and Junior Deacons, Senior and Junior Masters of Ceremonies, Senior and Junior Stewards, Chaplin, Marshal, Organist, Tyler, and a Historian, all of whom shall be appointed by the Worshipful Master on the evening of the Annual Election or Installation of Officers.

SECTION 3. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to deposit all money received by him into a depository designated by the lodge upon notice by the Secretary and the approval of the Lodge. He shall pay over to his successor in office, all money on hand and transfer his books and other property belonging to the Lodge within ten days after the expiration of his term of office. For his services to the Lodge, he shall receive the sum of Two Dollars (\$2.00) per member, per annum to be paid annually.

SECTION 4. There shall be a Secretary elected at the Annual Communication of the Lodge each December. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to notify candidates of their election or rejection, assign Investigation Committees with consent of the Worshipful Master, to process criminal background investigations of all Candidates for Election and Initiation, to render bills for dues annual, issue Annual Dues Cards as required, to collect and carefully record the receipts of all monies and pay the same without delay to the Treasurer and perform such other duties pertaining to his office as the Worshipful Master may direct including the production, printing, mailing and e-mailing of the Lodge's Monthly Trestleboard and submit on the first Regular Communication in January a report giving a summary of the proceeding of the Lodge for the year and immediately upon the expiration of his term of office, he shall submit to his successor all properties of the Lodge in his possession. For the faithful discharge of his duties the Secretary shall receive a stipend of Four Dollars (\$4.00) per member annually to be paid annually.

SECTION 4a. The Lodge shall pay the cost of admission for the Worshipful Master and his wife or girlfriend to attend the Feast of St. John, the Chairman's Ball, and The Grand Master and Junior Grand Wardens receptions. No motions or ballots shall be required.

ARTICLE II- OFFICERS- continued

SECTION 4B. The lodge shall pay the cost of hotel room expenses for the Worshipful Master, Senior and Junior Wardens, Secretary, Treasurer and the Proxy to Grand Lodge at the annual communication of The Most Worshipful Grand Lodge.

SECTION 5. There shall be a Board of Building Trustees, consisting of six members. Each year two Trustees shall be elected at the Annual Communication to serve for a term of three years. It shall be their duty to care for, preserve and maintain the property of the Lodge. The Building

Trustees shall prepare and submit a proposed budget for the ensuing Masonic Year at the annual Communication for approval of the Lodge. They may from time to time, request additional funding from the lodge should the need arise.

SECTION 6. There shall be a Board of Financial Trustees consisting of three members. One Trustee shall be elected at the Annual Communication to serve a three year term. The Board of Financial Trustees shall be responsible to procure and maintain adequate insurance for the property and furniture of the Lodge. They shall also secure and maintain a safe deposit box at the same Bank used by the Lodge. The trustees will confirm with the Lodge Secretary that it is paid for at least one year in advance each calendar year. Copies of all documents that go into it shall be given to the Secretary for record keeping purposes. Furthermore the trustees shall see to it that all important documents including but not limited to the deeds, titles, stocks and bond certificates, insurance policies, Past Masters Jewels and other valuables be kept in an adequately sized box. An inventory shall be given to the Secretary annually at the first meeting in December. It shall be the responsibility of the senior trustee to have the appropriate signatures changed each year and the keys passed onto his successor. The Financial Trustees shall have charge of all investments ordered to be made by the Lodge and in the name of the Lodge and provided such funds are to be invested in such bonds or public securities as those in which savings banks or fiduciary institutions of the State of New Jersey may lawfully invest funds; but provided no loans or investments shall be made on real estate mortgage.

When investments are once made, the same shall not be altered or transferred without the consent of the Lodge, given at a Regular Communication of which said proposal each member shall have one weeks' notice if possible. The Financial Trustees shall make a detailed report of the state of the invested funds and the income derived therefrom on the evening of the Annual Communication.

SECTION 7. In the event of a vacancy on either Board (Building or Financial) created by death, resignation, and removal or otherwise, the vacancy shall be filled by the Worshipful Master or an appointee of his choosing, until the next Annual Communication when an election shall be held to for the unexpired term so vacated.

SECTION 8. In addition to the duties prescribed in this manual, it shall be the duty of the Treasurer and Secretary to render annual reports at the first Regular Communication in January covering the financial operations for the preceding year.

ARTICLE III-FEES AND DUES

SECTION 1. The initiation fee shall be determined by consent of the lodge and may be periodically increased as per the recommendation of the financial trustees.

30% of the initiation fee shall accompany each candidate's petition. The balance shall be payable prior to his initiation. There shall also be paid by each candidate prior to his initiation, such sum as the Grand Lodge shall determine from time to time, as an initial contribution to charity.

ARTICLE III-FEES AND DUES- continued

SECTION 2. Should the petition of an applicant be rejected, he cannot renew his petition within three months of such rejection. The initial payment of 30% of the initiation fee is not refundable in the event of such rejection.

SECTION 3. The annual Lodge dues for each member shall be an amount voted on by the membership in September, plus any or all fees for charitable purposes otherwise as shall be determined from time to time by the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge, payable annually, in advance on or before the 31st of December each year provided however, that on granting a demit or certificate of withdrawal, the Lodge shall remit such portion of the dues as shall be unearned.

SECTION 4. Any member who shall be twelve (12) months in arrears for dues and shall not have paid his annual dues in accordance with the provisions of the preceding section shall be notified by the Secretary, who shall under the seal of the Lodge, demand payment of the same by certified mail. If after the expiration of three (3) months from the date of such formal notice and demand, report the fact to the Lodge for action under the fourteenth (14th) General Regulation of the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge.

SECTION 5 Any member who is seventy five (75) years old or older and has paid dues for forty (40) consecutive years to Laurel Lodge, shall be exempt from all future payment of all dues. The brother may voluntary remit such sums as are required by the Grand Lodge so as to relieve Laurel Lodge of this burden.

SECTION 6. Each initiate, in addition to all other fees or charges, each affiliate from a foreign jurisdiction and each dual member from a foreign jurisdiction and each dual member from a foreign jurisdiction shall be required to pay a sum that may vary from time to time as determined by The Grand Lodge to be applied to the usages of The Masonic Charity Foundation as directed by Grand Lodge.

ARTICLE IV- AMMENDMENTS TO THE BY-LAWS

Any proposition to amend or repeal these by-laws or any portion thereof, must be made in writing, signed by at least five (5) members in good standing, presented at a Regular Communication and lie over without debate until the next Regular Communication after it is published in the Trestleboard when a vote of the majority of members present, in favor of such proposition, shall be necessary for its adoption.

ARTICLE V- WORSHIPFUL MASTERS' CHARITY FUND

Each year the Lodge shall designate to the Worshipful Masters' Charity Fund and in addition, the Secretary shall, upon receipt of monies collected for the Worshipful Masters' Charity Fund at the Annual Installation, deposit the same in an account designated for this purpose. The Worshipful Master may, at his discretion; direct payment of any and all funds in the account, provided said payment is used for charitable purposes. This money shall not be carried over to the next Masonic year.

ARTICLE VI- COMMITTEES

On the evening of the Annual Communication of Officers or the Installation of Officers, the incoming Worshipful Master shall appoint the following Special Committees; Auditing, Masonic Education, Blood Bank, Scholarship, Entertainment and Kitchen or Refreshment.

AUDITING- A committee of three members, not holding other office, whose duty it shall be to examine the books, accounts and reports of the Treasurer, Secretary and Trustees and report in writing upon the accuracy of the same at the next Regular Communication after the reports of the other Officers and Trustees have been received at the second Communication in January or the first Communication in February if New Year's fall on the first Friday in January.

MASONIC EDUCATION- A committee of three members, whose duty it shall be to see that all elected candidates are aided in Masonic education in a friendly and fraternal way through the three degree, also to hold a class of instruction within one month of having been raised to the third degree. The purpose of this informal meeting is to impart information that will enable the newly raised brother to travel and visit in a confident and knowledgeable manner.

MASONIC BLOOD BANK- A chairman or committee shall be established to coordinate the participation of the Lodge in scheduled blood drives and represent the Lodge to the Grand Lodge Blood Bank Committee.

SICK AND VISITING- A committee of two or more members shall be formed, in addition to all Officers of the Lodge, to report on the progress and status of sick brethren and their families, send appropriate communications such as get well or sympathy cards to the sick and bereaved. Personal visits and phone calls are to be made when at all possible.

SCOLARSHIPS- A committee of three or more members shall administer the *John T. Reif* and the *Waylan A. Hann* Memorial Scholarships. The committee shall set the standards for qualification, with the consent of the Lodge, distribute the applications, review the applicants and select the winners.

REFRESHMENT- A chairman or committee shall be formed who's duty is shall be to see that refreshments are made available to the brethren after meetings or special events or at such times as designated by the Worshipful Master.

ENTERTAINMENT- A committee consisting of three or more members shall be formed, whose duty it shall be to make arrangements in conjunction with the Worshipful Master for Ladies Night, The Annual Banquet, Table Lodge or any other times or special events designated by the Worshipful Master.

ARTICLE VII- SALE, ACCUSITION, TRANSFERENCE OR LEASE OF REAL ESTATE OR PROPERTY

SECTION 1. The purchase, lease, mortgage or sale of any real estate owned by or to be acquired by Laurel Lodge #237 F&AM shall not be made unless a resolution is drawn and approved by not less than 75% of the members present. The vote shall take place at the next Regular Communication after the details of the transaction have been outlined in the Trestleboard.

SECTION 2. The transfer of Lodge funds from one account to another shall be at the discretion of the financial trustees and by permission of the Worshipful Master.

ARTICLE VIII-MASONIC LAW

Laurel Lodge #237 F&AM shall at all times be subject to and governed by the provisions of Masonic Law as contained in the Landmarks, Constitution and Laws of the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge for the State of New Jersey.
